Morning: God is Our Refuge (Psalm 37)

The Lord directs the steps of the godly. He delights in every detail of their lives. Though they stumble, they will never fall, for the Lord holds them by the hand. Psalm 37:23-24

God is our Refuge. A Refuge is a place of safety. A place of recovery. A place to rest and be restored. God walks with us and is steadfast in his love and faithfulness towards us. God is calling us to pray; to talk and listen, to communicate with him, to ask and intercede. We are to turn our attention away from what distracts us and towards him. If you are seeking something you are intently giving it your whole attention. He holds us by the hand.

In this season let us be a people who turn towards the God of hope, strength and refuge. Let us pray that many would discover, in God, a place of peace and wholeness.

- 1. **A PRAYER FOR MY LIFE:** God, I turn to you in prayer. I thank you that you are steadfast and faithful. You are my place of REFUGE. When I feel uncertain or fearful fill me afresh with strength and hope.
- 2. **A PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH:** God, for those who are overcome by fear and are tempted to run away, draw them back with your grace and love. May the church rise up in hope and faith to demonstrate and declare your love and kindness.
- 3. **A PRAYER FOR OUR WORLD:** God, this world needs a fresh revelation of your compassion and power. We cry out on behalf of those in need during the Covid-19 lockdown. Show them the reality of your presence. Make real to them the evidences of your grace. Save and rescue those in need.

Prayer Points:

- Pray for your church and other churches in your area. Pray for God's people, the church, to become people of refuge.
- Pray for compassion and courage to rise. Ask God for innovative and creative ways for people to turn to him.
- Pray for those who once followed Jesus. Ask God for them to return to faith.
- What specific people and places is God highlighting for you to pray?

Creative Idea: Build a den. Get creative.

A safe space. A place of refuge where you can shut out the noise. Crawl in and

pray for people who are finding the lockdown and uncertainty hard. Maybe someone who has lost a job. Maybe a friend from school. Perhaps someone who is ill. Read some verses from Psalm 37 and pray those for the people you know. Pray for those whose families are not safe spaces, and for those seeking to help them.





Midday: The Lord's Prayer (Luke 11: 2-4)

Stop and pray the Lord's Prayer. If possible, pause and say it out loud. Slowly. Think about each phrase.

- How are you sensing Father's presence?
- How can you worship God today?
- What does daily bread look like in your context?
- Where do we need to receive or offer forgiveness?
- In what area do you need to see God's Kingdom increasingly demonstrated?

Our Father, in heaven,
Holy is your Name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Evening: Healing

If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and **heal their land**. Now My eyes will be open and My ears attentive to prayer made in this place. 2 Chronicles 7:14-15 (NKJV)

As we continue to pray, seek, humble ourselves and turn from evil God responds to us and promises to bring forgiveness and healing. He will 'Heal/Restore their land', our land. This nation, your city, community and neighbourhood need God's power to bring transformation, healing, restoration and salvation. As we look around us there is much evidence of evil and sin, but God is more powerful than any tactic of the enemy. Let's cry out for the miraculous, for signs and wonders of his presence, activity and Kingdom.

- 4. **A PRAYER FOR MY LIFE:** God, greater are you in me, than any tactic of the enemy. Protect my heart, body, mind and soul as I contend in prayer and fasting. Show me how I can step out to see signs and wonders on my frontline.
- 5. **A PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH:** God, we long to see more evidence of your supernatural power. Bring healing, transformation, salvation and restoration. Nothing is impossible with you! In this time of lockdown may the church arise with fresh hope and faith.
- 6. **A PRAYER FOR OUR WORLD:** God, this world you created needs more and more of your presence and power. Bring your healing and restoration to the broken, lost, despairing and desperate. You are the hope of this world. Open eyes that they may see you Jesus!

Prayer Points:

- Physical healing (including people we know who are sick and those working on the front lines)
- Emotional/mental healing and well-being
- Financial healing for our economy, jobs, businesses, church finances.
- Spiritual healing for people to turn to God in the nation What specific people and/or places is God highlighting for you to pray?
- What young people or children can you pray for?

Creative Idea: Frontline Prayer

Get some plasters and a pen. Write down the names of people and places that need healing. Stick them to some cardboard/board as a reminder to keep praying for them.

Do you have any Emergency Services toys or items in the house? Any toy buses or trains? Get them and create a 'Frontlines' prayer spot. Every time you walk past this remember to pray for those on the frontlines.

Hallowed be your name, (Run hands over large imaginary name plaque

hanging above and in front of you)

Your Kingdom come; (Raise an ear to heaven as if listening for God's

Your will be done guidance)

On earth as it is in heaven. (Reach down and scoop up some "earth", rub it with

fingers)

Give us this day our daily bread. (Tip away the earth and with both hands lift up a

bread roll and tear it in two, mime eating a chunk)

And forgive us our sins, (Cup right hand as if holding sins, look into it then raise

it out front and to your right)

As we forgive those who

sin against us.

(Cup left hand, look at this then hold that out, so that you

are balancing left and right, like scales. Turn both hands

over and let all the sins go)

Lead us not into temptation, (Reach out for something, then stop and retract hand)

But deliver us from evil. (Hold hands up to shield face from danger)

For yours is the kingdom, (Sweep hands together in front of you as if collecting

up a large bundle)

The power, (Lift the imaginary bundle up high - just as God has the power to

carry us)

And the glory, (Sweep hands across and above you as if smoothing out the sky)

Forever and ever, (Remove watch from wrist and throw it away)

Amen. (Bow heads, with hands clasped)

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
