ORDINATION PLEDGE

CHARGE TO MINISTERS:

As General Superintendent of the Elim Pentecostal Church and as your brother and colleague in Christ, I put to you the following challenge and request your public response

1. Recognising its high and holy call, do you believe that you are truly called of God to the Christian ministry?
2. Believing that the Holy Scriptures, the inspired Word of God, are sufficient and final authority in all matters of teaching, doctrine, good conduct and discipleship, do you pledge your commitment to the expounding and honouring of God's Word?
3. Appreciating the importance of a good example, do you pledge faithfulness in prayer, preparation, and a lifestyle consistent with Christian ministry?
4. Do you affirm loyalty to Christ's Church, and particularly to the Elim Pentecostal Church, subscribing without reservation to its foundational truths and submitting to its Constitution and its discipline?
